

A Level French

Why study this course at Cronton Sixth Form?

You will be taught by excellent, well qualified teachers who put students at the heart of the curriculum. We keep languages class sizes small, to enable tutors to give you a higher level of support in this challenging, highly rewarding subject.

You will learn in a pleasant, well equipped language base with IT facilities via a variety of learning methods which include interactive computer-based activities.

You will participate in a range of cultural activities and university trips, visits by guest speakers and the opportunity for trips abroad.

You will develop an interest in and enthusiasm for language learning. You will develop understanding of the language in a variety of contexts and genres, which will in turn enhance your understanding of English. You will learn how to communicate confidently, clearly and effectively in the language. You will also develop awareness and understanding of the contemporary society, cultural background and heritage of the countries where the language is spoken. You will also develop a range of transferable skills from debating to researching and in doing so you will gain in confidence and independence as a learner.

What will I study?

You will develop the four key skills of reading, listening, writing and speaking that you started at GCSE as well as translation. You will also improve your ability to communicate effectively both in speaking and writing by studying, researching and discussing a range of exciting topics. These topics are centred around French-speaking societies and their evolution over time in terms of social, cultural and historical events. You will gain a range of transferable

skills including communication, critical thinking, research skills and creativity. In first year of A Level French you will learn a range of social issues and trends, aspects of the political and artistic culture of the countries where the language is spoken as well as the study of a film. In the second year of A level French you will study a further two major topics, the multicultural society and recent historical events, plus a literary text.

How will I be assessed?

Short grammar tests, written homework assignments (translations, listening and reading comprehension), timed essays, mock examinations (including speaking), group work and presentations.

Assessment is three exams: 1. Listening, reading and translation (40%), written response (30%) and speaking exam (30%).

Entry Requirements

A minimum of 3 x 5's and 2 x 4's at GCSE including a Grade 5 in English Language, a Grade 5 in Maths and a Grade 6 in French.

Can I study this course if I have not taken it at GCSE?

It is a requirement that you have studied French at GCSE.

A Centre of Excellence

French and Spanish are taught by native speaking tutors in the MFL Zone, which is well equipped with PCs, a projector and group workspace. Students are able to practise and develop their linguistic skills in an authentic and supportive environment. The MFL department encourages and promotes collaborative and independent learning among students in college.

Also, there are opportunities to visit local universities and to take part in language competitions in order to further develop and showcase students' abilities.

At degree level, you can choose to study a pure language degree or combine it with a subject of your choice, for example, Business, History, Politics, Law, English and many more.
