What will happen in my first week?

What will my timetable look like?

You will be in College for 3 days a week. During that time you will spend 9.5 hours a week learning the theory behind Business Studies whilst developing your own portfolio and coursework in the classrooms, most of which include computers to help you research and develop your skills although there will be some practical elements. You will also have a tutorial session with your Personal Tutor who will support you through your first year, track your progress and help you to prepare for university, apprenticeships or the career of your choice. You will also be assessed using a variety of methods including presentations, role plays, essays, reports, posters, external assessments and preparing/analysing financial documents. You will have the opportunity to take part in various enrichment events to enable you develop your skills in areas such as teamwork, presenting, debating, organising and time management. These could be in the form of clubs, trips and external speaker visits.
