What will happen in my first week?

During your first week, you will be introduced to your first project brief and begin exploring a range of creative disciplines. You'll take part in exciting trips and visits, attend drawing and printmaking workshops, and receive an introduction to digital creative software such as Adobe Photoshop. This is a great opportunity to meet your tutors and fellow students while getting a sense of the course.

Do I need to buy any equipment or kit?

No specialist equipment is required before you start. You will receive an essential equipment list during enrolment, outlining any materials and resources you may need throughout the course.

Who will teach me?

The course is led by Jamie Swift, Course Leader for Creative Practice, alongside Rachel O'Malley. Both bring a wealth of industry knowledge and experience across a broad range of creative disciplines, including Photography, Moving Image, Fine Art, Textiles and Illustration.

What can I look forward to in my first year?

Your first year is all about play, exploration and discovery. You'll have the opportunity to experiment with different materials, techniques and creative processes while developing your own ideas and interests. This is a year to build confidence, take creative risks and discover your strengths as a creative practitioner.

What will I study in my first term?

Your first-term project is designed to help you Explore, Develop and Apply your creativity. Through a series of practical workshops and creative activities, you will gain experience across a range of creative disciplines, materials and techniques. The project encourages experimentation, exploration and creative thinking, helping you build confidence, develop new skills and discover areas of practice that interest you.
