What will happen in my first week?

You will take part in a range of fun activities that will help you to get to know the other students in your group and the tutors who will teach you. You will be given an overview of the course and get to know the college a little better.

Do I need to buy any equipment or kit?

DBS form (police check) and a college polo shirt (mandatory with College), black trousers and flat black shoes for placement. You also need access to a computer, Internet and Time!

What will my timetable look like?

You'll attend college 3 days a week and complete 2 days of work placement. In college, you'll develop practical skills in a simulated ward for a health career.

You'll receive support from a personal tutor through ASPIRE sessions, including help with studies and university applications. You'll also research assignments to build independent learning skills.

What can I look forward to in my first year?

This course offers a nationally recognised qualification, covering clinical skills, anatomy, diseases, and infection control. You'll complete 315 hours of industry placement and gain the knowledge to progress to university courses such as nursing or other health professions.

What other modules will I be studying in my first year?

In your first year, you will study modules such as working within the health and science sector, health and safety regulations, managing information and data, principles of good scientific and clinical practice, understanding the healthcare sector, providing person-centred care, supporting health and wellbeing, and infection prevention and control.

Are there any books I need to buy or useful websites I should look at?

- Most resources are available on the SOLAR virtual learning platform, with guidance provided at the start of the course.
- You don't need to buy textbooks, but recommendations are available if needed.
- You'll use sources like the NHS website and other academic materials to support your research
