What will happen in my first week?

What can I look forward to on this course?

This exciting 1-year course is designed to equip you with the necessary skills and knowledge to enter a career within the uniformed protective services. Alternatively, the course will also help you gain entry onto our Level 3 Extended Diploma in Uniformed Protective Services or other Level 3 courses should you wish to stay in education for longer than just one year. You will study a range of interesting subjects some theoretical and some practical. As part of your studies, you will learn new skills such as team working, problem solving and leadership skills. You should expect to take part in fitness activities as part of the course, as well as enrichment activities. Guest speakers from public services visit us at the college and you will also have some opportunities to visit them.

Which units will I study?

The Role and Work of the public services (exam), Working Skills in the Public Services, Health, Fitness and Lifestyle for the Public Services, Citizenship, Society and the Public Services (exam), Crime and its Effects of Society and Individuals, Law and its Impact on the Individual, Land Navigation by Map and Compass, Multi-Day Expedition Experience.

What will my timetable look like?

You will attend college 3 days a week, combining practical activities with classroom learning to build skills for public service careers. The course includes work experience, voluntary work, and weekly support from a Personal Tutor to help with goals, workload, and CV development. You will also study theory, complete assessments, and improve your English and Maths (if needed).
