# **APPRENTICESHIP**

















- •Work-based learning
- •Usually paid, with a contract of employment (Minimum apprenticeship wage is £3.70 per hour)
- •Substantial training and development of transferable employability skills
- •Not just the easy option! combination of hard work and commitment to studying up to degree level
- •The opportunity for further training or employment opportunities.

Name	Level	Equivalent educational level
Intermediate	2	5 GCSE passes (grade A*-C or 9-4)
Advanced	3	2 A-level passes/ Level 3 Diploma/ International Baccalaureate
Higher	4, 5, 6 and 7	Foundation degree and above
Degree	6 and 7	Bachelor's or master's degree



# DEGREE APPRENTICESHIP

- A combination of full time work (30+ hours a week) and university study
- You become an employee of the company AND a student of the university
- You can gain up to a Bachelors or Masters degree
- You are employed, so you earn a wage or salary
- You do not pay tuition fees as this is already funded by the company, university and the government
- Hands-on, practical learning from day one
- A great head start into a career (+ potential to stay at company







# Apprenticeship Requirements and Application.



- Entry requirements are different for each Apprenticeship!
- Level 3 qualification (maybe with specific subjects and grades) A Levels or Vocational.
- You will have to meet certain GSCE grades and achieve UCAS points for Degree Apprenticeships
- Application and interview for the company to discuss personal qualities, and skills
  ...which are almost as important as grades!
- Attending Assessment Centre's
- Passing online tests

- Check regularly as vacancies appear at different times
- Check company websites for job listings
- The process is competitive so apply early
- Get help and support with applications/interviews from your personal tutor, ACE team or family.

## **Gap Year**

- Called a 'gap' as you have a plan for the end of the year (e.g. a university place)
- Can be a time to gain employability and experience, through volunteering or work, or gain life experience through travel etc.
- Also could be used to support university journey i.e. lessons or experience preparing for auditions in performing arts or similar
- MUST be constructive and support your future!

## Other Opportunities

#### **Professional Training**

- •Opportunities to train with a professional organisation, rather than in a traditional education setting
  - •Gain skills, employability, training and a qualification
- •Typically you would have to pay for this as no longer in free education (18+) but sometimes you can be sponsored by an organisation

Level 3 Certificate in Supporting Teaching and Learning in Schools Level 3 Diplomas in media make-up, hair, beauty, sports, catering, other vocational subjects

Bronze, Silver, Gold Arts Awards

Training in performing arts or musical qualifications

#### **Volunteering**


#### Local

- Many short or long term opportunities, with charities and organisations
- •Chance to make a difference in your community, while gaining valuable skills
- Examples include British Red Cross; The Prince's Trust; Alder Hey NHS; PDSA; National Trust Conservation

### International

- Many different opportunities in many countries
- •Some are funded, some you pay for
- Example organisations Lattitude Global Volunteering, International Citizen Service (ICS), Cam America, Raleigh International
